# CLUSTER #1

## vertical



one photo 3.5" x  
5" portrait  
orientation

1

optionally add  
narrow white mat



one photo 3.5" x 5"  
portrait orientation

optionally add  
narrow white mat

select 3 patterned  
papers to be used in  
small amounts and a  
background paper

2

choose patterns to  
support story; choose  
mix in motif, scale  
and density



cut three strips and  
layer to right of  
canvas behind photo

3

lengths are in 2"  
increments:  
5.5", 7.5", and 9.5"

widths are in .5"  
increments:  
2", 2.5", 3"

final sizes are  
2.5" x 7.5"  
3" x 5.5"  
1.5" x 9.5"



add foundational  
misting, sprinkling,  
splattering from  
bottom left to top  
right of cluster (an  
upward diagonal)

# CLUSTER #1 (continued)



add title, journaling and tape or paper strip in a way that they add short horizontal lines to the cluster

5

avoid journaling with regular block shape; rather, stagger beginning and end of lines



add embellishments to ground, to add repetitions with variety, to create flow on the page

6

add first embellishing cluster along left side of photo incorporating elements with length (like feather, leaves, flourish)

7

use two colors that will be repeated



add embellishing at  
top right of cluster  
and bottom left of  
page to emphasize  
upward diagonal  
flow

## CLUSTER #2

# circle + bracket cluster



select three photos  
one 4" square  
two 3" square

1

add narrow white  
mats or strokes to  
photos



choose a  
background paper

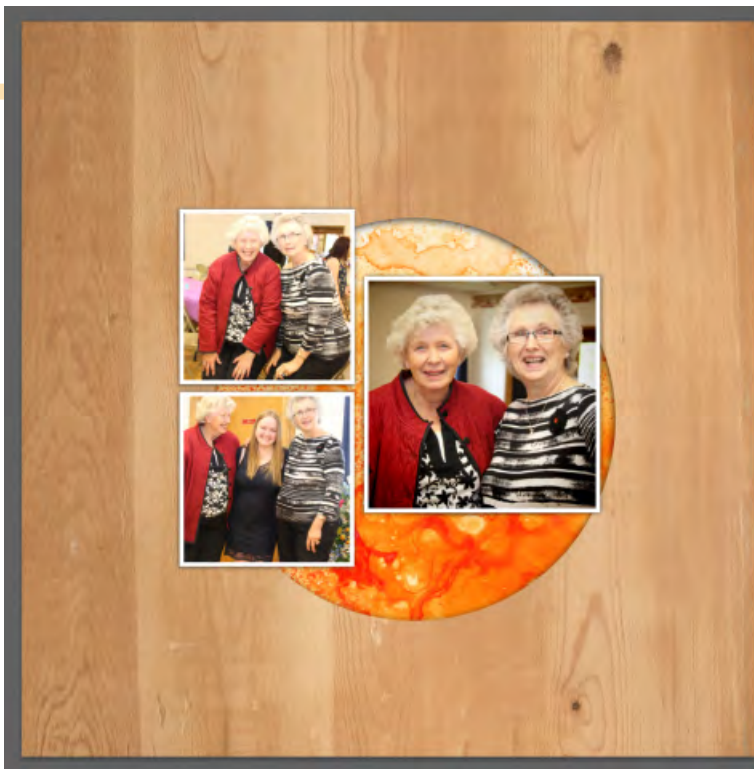

choose a tone-on-  
tone or neutral print  
and cut a 6.5" circle  
foundational piece

3

layer circle behind  
photos a bit to the  
right of center





choose 4 coordinated patterned papers

4

cut two horizontal strips:  
8" and 9" long  
vary widths by .5"

5

cut two vertical strips  
6.5" and 7.5" long  
vary widths by .5"

arrange as "L  
bracket" behind



add 3" x 4" journaler

6

layer behind photos,  
poking up to  
continue upward  
steps started by  
vertical strips in  
bracket

add journaling to it

## CLUSTER #2 (continued)



look for curved elements to layer into the cluster

7

add biggish curves to bottom and left of cluster



your title will layer over elements within the cluster

8

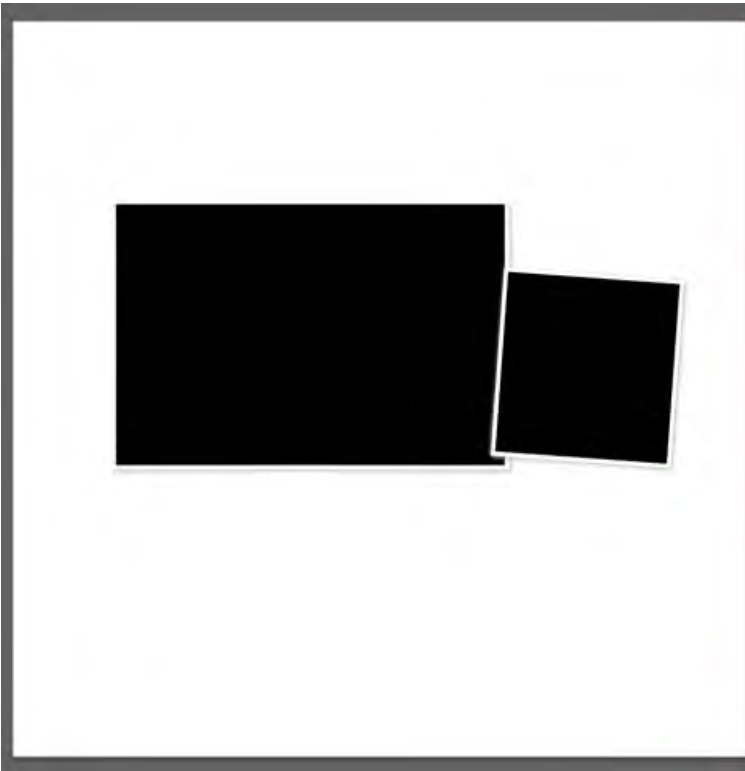
it will function as both title and embellishment--you will pull color, shape or texture from title for embellishing



repeat colors and textures from title in other embellishment points building a circular flow but leaving the top right area of the cluster open (don't box the arrangement in)

## CLUSTER #3

# loose cluster

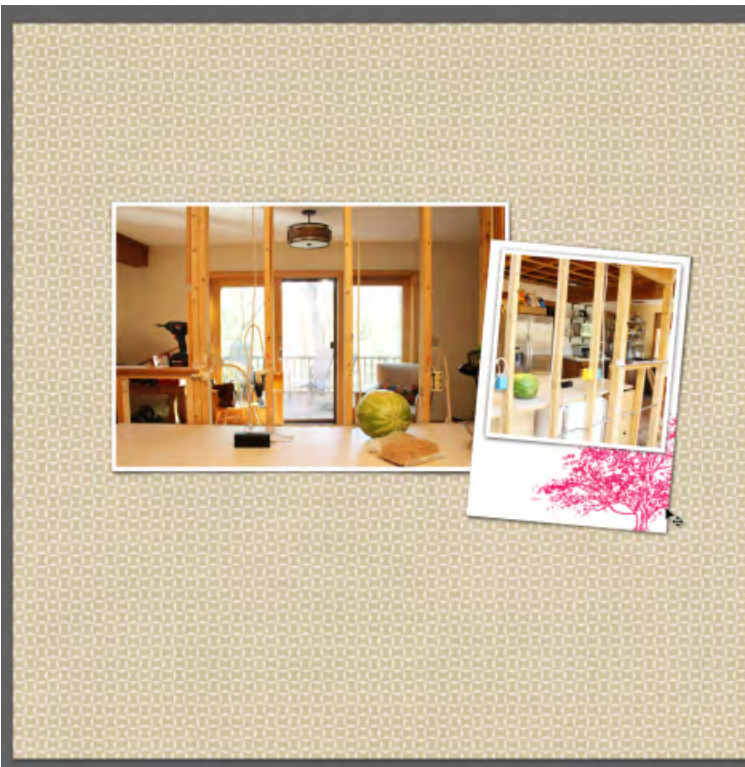


1  
choose two photos  
(one) 6" x 4" landscape  
oriented  
(one) 2.75" square

add narrow mat or  
stroke to smallest  
photo (and optionally  
to larger)

place photos together  
above vertical center  
and approximately at  
horizontal center

tilt and overlap  
smaller photo



2  
choose a  
background paper

choose a 3"x4"  
journaler or cut a  
card from patterned  
paper -- it should  
include some bold  
color that is not in  
your photos

place it behind your  
smaller photo

add a title in large, high-contrast alphas below both of the photos and spanning much of their width

add a high impact, oversized embellishment (or cluster) to the left of the title - be sure to include your bold accent color (stuck on this? handcut a heart or star and add stenciling to it. diecut a story-supporting shape and mist it)



## CLUSTER #3 (continued)



add journaling directly to the canvas and very close to your cluster - use it to expand the cluster shape in an organic way

finish with pieces that:

\* build on an organic cluster shape

finish with pieces that:

- \* build on an organic cluster shape
- \* complete a visual triangle of your first bold color



finish with pieces that:

- \* build on an organic cluster shape
- \* complete a visual triangle of your first bold color
- \* add a visual triangle of a 2nd bold color
- \* fasten and ground

# CLUSTER #4

## big cluster



select one large portrait-oriented photo and several shots that can be trimmed to smaller than 3" in width or height

the large photo here is 4.5" x 8"

optionally add narrow mat or stroke to larger photo

1



arrange small photos:

align several on their left edges -- thus creating a gutter (and strong line) between the grouping and the large photo

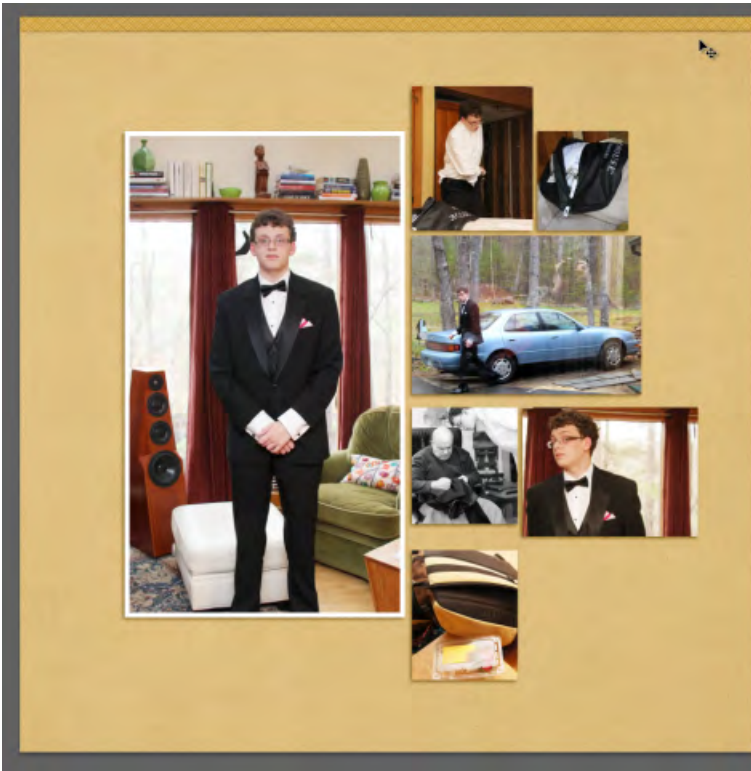
arrange somewhat in rows

create an organic, curving right edge for grouping

leave a spot for journaling

choose solid background paper

3

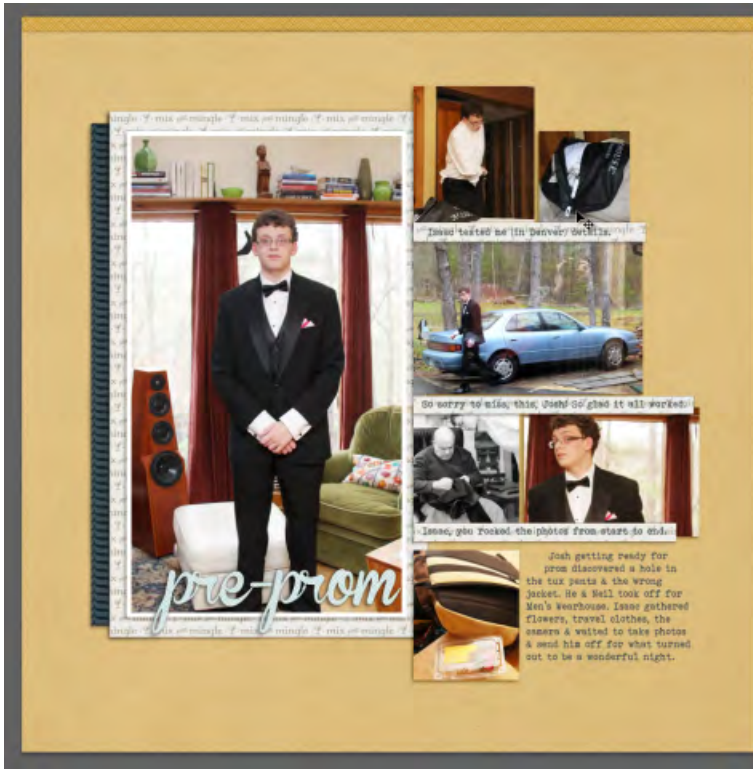
consider added a border strip at top or bottom for interest



layer two blocks of patterned paper below focal point photo to give it a foundation and interest

# CLUSTER #4 (continued)



add journaling in the block you save for it -- somewhere in the grouping of smaller photos

5

add additional journaling, thoughts, quotes, or messages on strips layered between the "rows" of your photo cluster

begin embellishing with largest cluster at bottom left of large photo and near title -- choose a color to repeat in two other spots to create a visual triangle

7



begin embellishing with largest cluster at bottom left of large photo and near title -- choose a color to repeat in two other spots to create a visual triangle

begin two other embellishment points with repeated color in smaller doses

8



begin embellishing with largest cluster at bottom left of large photo and near title -- choose a color to repeat in two other spots to create a visual triangle

begin two other embellishment points with repeated color in smaller doses

layer clusters, giving them foundations and variety, and--finally--fasteners!

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
